“New Year - New Insights?”



The month of August is arguably the most important month of the year. It is the month that begins the academic year and the month that precedes the Jewish New Year. As such, we are filled with great hope for the future as well as considerable anxiety about the amount of preparation and commitment required for the tasks that lay ahead.

During August, we recite Haftarat of Consolation following the commemoration of Tisha B'Av which recalls the destruction of the ancient Temple in Jerusalem. Thus, each of the Shabbatot in August contains the comforting words of Isaiah who assures us that the covenant between God and Israel will endure and that Israel will find ultimate redemption.

How can we transform Isaiah's words into practical significance for our daily lives and for our goals for the coming year? Rashi, the 11th century commentator of the Torah and Talmud, offers a helpful insight through his comment on Parashat Ekev. The Hebrew word “*ekev*” comes from the root that means “heel” (Ya'akov/Jacob's name is from the same root as he was born holding onto Esau's heel). In modern Hebrew the root forms the word “*ikvol*” that means “footprints.”

Rashi picks up on the association with heel and suggests that it refers to those *mitzvot* that appear relatively unimportant so that one tends to “trample upon them with one's heels.” What are examples of *mitzvot kalot*—the “lighter” commandments? He cites “*simchat haregel*” (enjoying the holidays) and “*dibbur leshon hakodesh*” (speaking Hebrew) and thereby suggests that since we cannot decipher the intentions of God, we should treat the so called “lighter” commandments with the same respect as those that appear to be more serious. Rashi concludes by saying, “If you keep even these ‘*ekev mitzvot*,’ then God will send you blessing.”

Indeed, religious life is a function of what we do with even the little or light things. Details are important and every small act is significant. Our

ambitious goals and dreams that require years of hard work to accomplish are the product of many seemingly small and inconsequential actions. We should never underestimate the power of one word or the impact of a simple gesture of kindness.

As Beth Tzedec enters a new year, I encourage you to add your voice and your deeds to our goals and vision for the future. Each time you are present at the synagogue, each time you participate in an activity, and every expression of support adds to the overall effort to grow and enhance the quality of our community. With the talents and resources evident among our membership, I am confident that 5771 will bring us closer to realizing our vision of stimulating learning, spiritual growth, and compassion to nurture innovative Jewish life in the home, synagogue, and community.

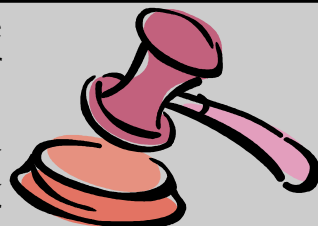

A Note from the Chazzan

As I write this article for the upcoming bulletin, it has just turned into July which is traditionally the start of the Summer holidays and many people turn their thoughts to Summer cottages or vacations. In another life, my family used to leave Toronto to head up to Halliburton Ontario, where we had a country house that became a year round place with a lot of fixing and weather proofing. It was beautiful to go up to the country, sit in a canoe on a lake with a fishing rod early in the

morning and enjoy the magnificent canvas of G-d's creations. The water was like glass, the loons would sometimes break the peace with their cries and you might hear the occasional frog. A Word from Leonard Cohen

Ritual/Program Director

Tefilah and *Cheshbon Nefesh*: Prayer and “Soul-Accounting”

According to the Ropshitzer (Rabbi **Naftali Tzvi Horowitz** of Ropshitz):

“A person should not declare, ‘I cannot pray at this time because my thoughts are all distracted; I will wait until I can pray with the proper concentration.’ Rather, that person should pray at the appointed time to the best of his or her ability. It is written: --

And from there you will seek the Lord your God’ (Deuteronomy 4:29).

This means – at any place, at any time where you are.”

The idea of commencing our prayers – from where we find ourselves – is particularly appropriate at this time of year, during the month of Elul leading up to the High Holidays. Traditionally, Elul is a month for *Cheshbon Nefesh* – literally, a “soul-accounting” – the process by which we examine ourselves and our deeds in earnest, in order to determine what changes we need to make in our lives.

The use of the word *Cheshbon*, “accounting”, is no mere haphazard. Accounting in business involves a systematic processing and review of objective data – in the form of money and assets – in order to understand one’s business situation clearly. In the spiritual terms of Judaism, we are challenged to look at ourselves objectively, using the best information and critical means available, to assess our situation more clearly and determine how we need to evolve.

Synagogues are meant to provide a place and a community to assist in these important reflections. The aim of the Jewish prayer service is to provide an opportunity to look upon ourselves through God’s eyes. Even if it does not always succeed in achieving this lofty aim, the regular practice of *tefilah* can greatly assist and strengthen us in understanding our lives.

Thus, we come back to the Ropshitzer’s words. Our challenge is to start now, from right where we are, to reach out to God and find ways to connect more closely. Attending prayer service at shul, even if only on an occasional basis, can provide a helpful way to strive towards greater spiritual strength and well-being. It is my profound objective to work with Rabbi Osadchey and Chazzan Edwards to make prayer services more meaningful and accessible to Beth Tzedec members, and to enable this community to support one another in attaining greater happiness and fulfillment.

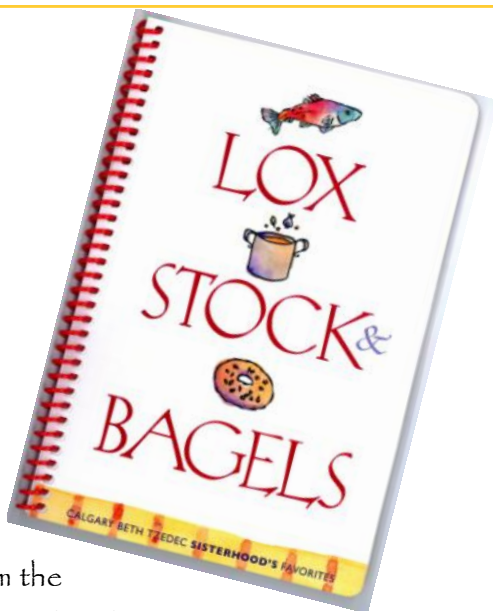

Good Grief

The Jewish vision of healing, called *refuah shleimah*, or “complete healing” comprises both body (*refuat haguf*) and soul (*refuat hanefesh*). *Refuah shleimah* shows us that Judaism considers body, mind and soul to be vital parts of the healing process. This Jewish vision of healing, therefore, fits well with the work being done by passionate members of the TODAH committee and participants of the KADDISH

grief support group at the Beth Tzedec. TODAH members provide caring for those in need of hospital visitation, follow up at their homes, good wishes through the mail, and being ever alert to attend to our members’ physical, emotional and spiritual needs. (To all Beth Tzedec members we ask that you call Rabbi or Bobbie if there is a member hospitalized or in need. Please don’t assume we know who is ill and in the hospital!)

Along with the concept of *refuah shleimah* we are taught to recognize that healing can still occur even when there is no longer the possibility of a cure. Grief often obscures our ability to notice beauty, experience joy, or delight in life’s pleasurable moments. One Sunday each month for two hours, KADDISH, a *grief support group* that is open to every Jew in Calgary, meets at Beth Tzedec. The group is designed to assist individuals in coping with grief in a group environment where we recognize the individual and personal factors that shape the expression of grief. Anyone who is suffering a loss of any kind may attend with no commitment beyond that session. Our next meeting will be August 8 at 11:00 a.m.

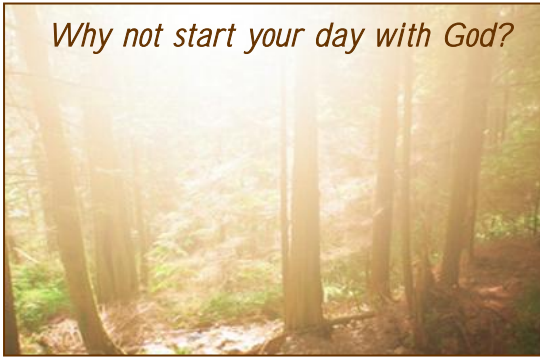
